#### East View Cartographic

- → affiliate of East View Publications (est. 1989)
- → EVP is by far the largest supplier of vernacular-language open-source information from Russia/CIS to US Government
- + entire company (140 people) oriented toward supplying open-source information from Russia/CIS
  - produced by Russians
  - acquired by Russians
- + specialty is formerly classified information
- + cartographic information since 1993

# Russian Military Cartography Major topographic map series

- + city plans (1:10,000 and 1:25,000 scales)
- → 1:50,000 scale topographic
- → 1:100,000 scale topographic
- → 1:200,000 scale topographic

#### Russian Military City Plans

- + systematic access since Oct 1996
- → ca. 1700 cities available (excluding FSU)
- → digital vector format only
- + about 20 cities currently ready

- + scales from 1:10,000 to 1:25,000
- → majority of vintages from 1980-1996
- → new production and revisions continue
- all existing plans may be updated on ad hoc basis

# Military City Plans Why only digital availability?

- + Original paper plans still classified
- **→** Some exceptions
  - non-Russian sources
  - Russian raster sources
  - Russian paper sources
- → Apparent belief that digital-only availability allows selective release of information
  - BUT, plans acquired so far appear to be complete

- attribute data
- uniqueness
- vintage
- format
- delivery time
- price
- will the door close?

file format issues

- → currently, default format is Map/Info internal format (TAB)
- → in theory, conversion to most any other file format is possible
- → EVC has supplied in MIF and DXF so far
- → no experience yet with VPF
- + a very time-consuming problem

## Military City Plans

Text elements

- + Three types
  - urban military geography narrative
  - list of militarily important objects
  - comprehensive street index
- → Much unique material
- + Must be translated
- + Link to vector map?

#### Geographic names issues

- → EVC orders all names in Cyrillic alphabet
- → VTU has strict transliteration regimes
- → Machine transliteration exists and can be refined

East View Cartographic products/services

- ◆ Original-edition city plans, all layers
- + Updated city plans, all layers
- + DTMs/DEMs
- ◆ Text elements (Russian and English)
- ◆ Paper output: color plots
- **→** Format conversion
- → Original paper or raster prints where available
- **→** Collection of attribute information



#### Pricing questions

- + Production cost
  - originally, tied to number of sheets
  - now, tied to area (sq. km) of city
- + Site licenses

#### The Russian Cartographic Behemoth

- + Topographic production: Civilian vs. Military
  - civilian: 18 regional enterprises under FSGK
    - Russian Federation territory only (but formerly entire USSR)
    - ◆ 525,000 sheets (scales 10k-1m), 12-year revision cycle
    - another 200,000+ sheets with 1:5k and 1:2k scale plans
  - military: Military Topographic Directorate (VTU)
    - territorial responsibility:
      - military editions of RF territory sheets
      - production/military editions of CIS territory sheets
      - production of all foreign territory sheets
    - 60,000 sheets (not including FSU), revision cycle varies from years to 40+

## Russian Military Topographic Maps 1:200,000 scale

- → near-worldwide coverage
  - Eastern hemisphere exceptions: Australia, NZ, Micronesia, Kalimantan, Papau-New Guinea, small islands of Indonesia
  - Western hemisphere exceptions: northern Canada, central Greenland, 2/3 of South America
- → 16,000 (non-FSU) + 4,800 (FSU) sheets total
- → ca. 8,000 sheets include military geographic assessment on reverse (EH sheets only, minus most of Africa, India, Arabian peninsula and northern Siberia)
- → all available commercially except RF territory

## Russian Military Topographic Maps 1:100,000 scale

- + extensive coverage, including
  - entire FSU, Europe and Japan
  - entire Asian continent (except Tibet, southern India, central Arabian Peninsula)
  - most of northern Africa from Morocco to Somolia
  - 2/3 of USA, including entire coastal regions and all military bases and missile fields
  - Cuba
- → 23,000 (non-FSU) + 21,000 (FSU) sheets total
- + all but RF territory now available commercially

# Russian Military Topographic Maps 1:50,000 scale

- ♦ still extensive coverage, including
  - entire FSU
  - entire Europe (except northern UK, Ireland)
  - entire Korean Peninsula
  - 1/4 of PRC (primarily northwestern)
  - extensive Middle East, including most of Turkey, all of Israel/Palestine/Lebanon and surrounding region, northern Iran, entire Afghanistan
  - Cuba
- + 23,000 (non-FSU) + 70,000 (FSU) sheets total
- + commercial paper access problematic
- → digital access OK except for RF

#### Digital Vector Topographic Maps Russian Federation Territory

- + 1:1,000,000 scale
  - 176 sheets (complete RF coverage)
  - ca. 20 layers/sheet
  - completed in late 1995
  - all sheets commercially available
- + 1:200,000 scale
  - 3571 sheets (complete RF coverage)
  - ca. 50 layers/sheet
  - completed in 1996
  - all sheets commercially available

#### Geographic Names Issues

- → place names (estimated over 500,000)
- → hydrographic names (est. over 100,000)
- → transportation names (est. over 50,000)
- + plus, much additional attribute data
