He runs an annual conference dedicated to gray literature that is small but select, and recommended.

The third is by Ms. Bonnie Klein from the Defense Technical Information Center, a lady that I consider one of the more dedicated proponents and masters of gray literature on the U.S. Government side, and a logical focal point for anyone wishing to learn more about U.S. Government programs, capabilities, and deficiencies in this critical open source area.
